Please read this information sheet about what to expect when staying at Pumula Guest Farm

What to expect

- Pumula Guest Farm is a working farm.
- One of the local farmers lease our arable land and plant maize or soy beans.
- The farmer, renting at the moment, rotates his sheep and cattle to graze on the farm.
- Reception is for booking-in purposes only, there is no member of staff at reception any other time. You are welcome to contact us on our mobiles with any questions.
- There is **no TV** in any of the units.
- There is no WIFI.
- The swimming pool is painted black to heat the water a little.
- No luxury fittings were used in any of the units.
- Most of the bed frames were welded on the farm or at the sign manufacturing factory in Johannesburg.
- Our personal preference is firm mattresses and thus all the mattresses are high density foam.
- Accommodation is very basic farm accommodation.
- Facilities in each unit are basic but comfortable.
- Maintenance is done regularly and on guest recommendations/suggestions.
- We used wood found on the farm in the units, for example as curtain rods and bathroom hooks.
- Most of the buildings and equipment were built around 2002/3.
- The Farm House Apartments were finished in 2009.
- The White House bathroom was redone in 2016
- The farm has ESKOM electricity.
- Expect power failures from time to time due to wind and rain storms or veld fires.
- Power failures are usually restored within 4 hours.
- Each unit has an oil lamp and candles in case of a power failure.
- Units either have a main gas stove or a little portable gas stove.
- All units have gas geysers.
- Expect cold in winter.
- Water pipes freeze during **exceptional** cold spells which could disrupt water supply to the showers and baths.

- Each unit has a fireplace in the lounge the bedrooms get cold.
- Beds have duvets and blankets for the cold.
- There are no heaters or electric blankets in any of our units.
- There is a night watchman on duty at night with a dog.
- The main gate is closed at night and opened again in the morning.
- Expect varying degrees of cell phone reception.
- There is no shop on the premises to buy food or drinks.

History

- We bought the farm in 2002 and moved here from Johannesburg.
- The farm had 2 houses and non-functional dairy facilities.
- We lived in the one house (now the Farm House Apartments) and the farm manager lived in the other house (now the White House).
- Kevin stayed in Johannesburg and ran his sign manufacturing company while Guilletta and their 2 young boys moved to the farm permanently.
- We liked the area and the farm so much that we wanted to share the experience and thus the guest farm project started.
- Kevin designed and built all the additional units on the farm with the help of a local builder and local labour.
- Kevin designed and built the pool and communal Club House and facilities.
